From Across My Window Sill

Moving has its fun - like going through the box containing records and paraphernalia from the Clear Business and Professional Women's Club, a chapter of the state and national BPW organization. A short description of its mission is "Working women helping working women."

The Clear chapter was chartered on April 26, 1966. These names will bring back memories for a few of you. The charter members were Jauna Edwards, Marjory Shields (Roat), Charlotte Borgesson, Laura Bostain, Fredene Brown, Judith Howard, Susan Lockwood, Patty Moore, Catherine Rinaldi, Verne Ruth, Maxine Schwab, Lavone Tufford and Janice Wike. Within a few months they were joined by Joyce Nolan, Rita Berchefeldt, Irene Kehoe, Sarah Pelfrey, Vanetta Warren, Barbara Gorman, Margaret Nelson, Jean O. Murray and Gertrude Whitten.

Clarification: I am not Jean O. Murray. However, Jean O. was a teacher when we arrived in 1971 and soon, depending on the context of the conversation, one of us became the "other Jean Murray." For those of you who are relatively new to town, Gertrude Whitten was the grandmother of Michele Napoleon Nelson. Gerry Nelson, the husband of Margaret (now deceased) returns to their home across from the Dew Drop Inn each summer. Marjory Roat is Karen Southwood's mother and was the first president of the new organization. Jauna is the wife of John Edwards whose history of the area was published here recently.

Marge Roat recalls that sometime in 1965-6, Jauna suggested, "Let's start a BPW." Marge had responded, "A what?" Jauna had been a member of the Fairbanks club which sponsored the Clear club.

The box also contains photographs, memorabilia, and a number of copies of "The Hot Line," a weekly newspaper published by the Base Recreation Association. All the copies (mid 1967-69) here are related to some activity of the BPW. Unfortunately, only the minutes through 1981 are in the box - who knows where the subsequent ones are? If anyone has them stuck away some place please let us know.

I have taken it upon myself to place these BPW papers in the Archives at the University of Alaska Fairbanks. At the moment we are working with Asst. Archivist, Della Hill. The collection will be indexed as Anderson and will be available to anyone. Any of you can add to the collection - photos, school memorabilia, newspaper clippings, city activities - anything someone has saved over the years - just because. It is not unusual for individual papers of persons in a community to be included in a collection. For example if a former mayor has kept papers from his/her term they could be included - or anyone who has papers of historical significance for that matter. It's much more available than you might think. They can be mailed to Della Hill, Archivist, University of Alaska Archives, zip 99775. Thirty years from now someone may be looking for information about their grandfather or an aunt. I'll have more to share the next time.

This is also a call to anyone who has a collection of either the Hot Line or the Wave Guide (which followed the Hot Line) and anticipates that no one in the family wants them. Copies of the Anderson Advocate, a newsletter during the 1980s, were regularly sent to the Archives, so those have been preserved.

The only time it is difficult to get to the archives is the first time you go. The archives are in the Library of UAF. It is most easily accessed from Geist Rd, left at Fairbanks St., then right on Tanana Loop and left at the stop sign, up the hill (Chandalar) and right on Salcha St. These are all short distances. There is visitor parking in lots on either side of the Eielsen Building with the Library just beyond. As I say, after the first time it gets easy. Go have lunch at the Wood Center.

I do have a tip - which I have not followed very well: put names with the photos, where they were taken and approximate date. Much easier said than done but....
